

Resource Conservationist

Full time position opening

Overview

The primary function of this position is to review erosion and sediment plans, inspect erosion controls on earth-moving sites, investigate complaints and assist with other delegated programs as assigned and in accordance with the Clean Streams Law, Chapter 102 Erosion and Sedimentation Control. This position will also provide technical assistance and education to the public, government agencies, technical professionals, and others. The position divides its time between field and office settings.

Expectations

- Ability to communicate effectively with a diverse stakeholder group
- Cooperative personality, courteous, respectful, and high integrity
- Ability to work unsupervised
- Ability to remain calm and handle potentially contentious situations
- Confidence to document evidence and present a case for enforcement
- Ability to read plans and understand construction sequences or a willingness to learn
- Knowledge of Allegheny County (desirable but not required)
- Ability to walk rough terrain and steep slopes
- Have a current Pennsylvania Driver's license or the ability to obtain one
- Knowledge to review erosion control plans, or the ability and willingness to learn.

Education/Experience

Bachelor's Degree; Associate's Degree + 2 years of experience; High School equivalency + 5 years of experience.

The most desirable candidates will hold a degree or have a background in drafting, code enforcement, engineering technology, geology, earth sciences, environmental studies, energy technology, or resource management, or have 5 years' experience in site development and earthmoving work.
