

Senior Resource Conservationist

Overview

The primary function of this position is to ensure compliance with PA Chapters 102 and 105 which outline requirements to protect soil and water quality.

Essential job functions include: reviewing erosion and sediment plans, field site inspections and assisting with other programs as assigned. This position provides technical assistance and education to the public, government agencies, technical professionals and others, with duties in field and office settings.
